Dimon's Latest Rhetoric

"Every day we should try to do maximum harm to those countries that have imposed these restrictions. Harm their economies, their institutions and their rulers. Harm the well-being of their citizens, their confidence in the future."

Diplomats say Medvedev gives a flavour of hardline and high-level thinking in the Kremlin, though Kyiv and Kremlin critics play down his influence, casting him as a scaremonger whose job is to deter Western action over Ukraine.

In his latest comments he spoke of the need to find critical vulnerabilities in Western economies, to target energy, industry, transport, banking and social services, and to stir up social tensions.

Western officials have already spoken about suspected Russian sabotage activities across the West, including arson, with some calling for Russian diplomats' movements to be curbed.

The Kremlin, which said on Thursday it was considering retaliatory action against the U.S. that would best suit Moscow's own interests, and the Russian foreign ministry have rejected the sabotage allegations as false.

'FAKE NEWS'

Medvedev, who styled himself as a Western-friendly liberal during his 2008-12 presidency before reinventing himself as one of the Kremlin's toughest hawks, spoke of the need to step up an information war against the West.

"Are they screaming about our use of fake news? Let's turn their lives into a crazy nightmare in which they can't distinguish wild fiction from the realities of the day, infernal evil from the routine of life," he wrote.

Medvedev also called for Russia to weaponise space and arm the West's enemies, as the new U.S. sanctions forced Russia's leading exchange to halt dollar and euro trading, obscuring access to reliable pricing for the Russian currency.

Other new U.S. measures included targeting China-based firms selling semiconductors to Moscow and a move to raise "the risk of secondary sanctions for foreign financial institutions that deal with Russia's war economy", effectively threatening them with losing access to the U.S. financial system.

Group of Seven leaders were meanwhile gathering at their annual summit in Italy on Thursday and looked likely to announce that they have agreed at least in principle, on plans to issue \$50 billion of loans for Ukraine using interest from frozen Russian sovereign assets to back the multi-year debt package.

Kremlin's toughest hawks underscores the broader transformation within the Russian leadership as they struggle to maintain control and project strength despite growing international isolation and economic challenges.

Medvedev's personality traits align with the concepts of malignant narcissism, Machiavellianism, psychopathy, and Schadenfreude. His grandiose self-image, lack of empathy, strategic manipulation, antisocial tendencies, and pleasure in the misfortunes of others provide a comprehensive psychological profile. His aggressive rhetoric, strategic manipulation, lack of remorse, and gloating tone reflect his complex personality driven by power, ambition, security, and a calculated approach to maintaining influence and control.

Strategically challenging Medvedev's authority involves publicly questioning his competency and decision-making skills, highlighting failures during his tenure, and emphasizing his secondary role compared to Putin. Disrespecting his achievements by attributing them to others and criticizing his modernization programs undermines his successes. Threatening his security and stability involves bringing attention to dissent and opposition within Russia and leaking information that suggests weaknesses in his security measures. Challenging his social standing and relationships means using media to spread stories that paint him negatively and suggest that allies are distancing themselves from him. Questioning his intellectual and strategic capabilities involves mocking his aggressive statements and criticizing his strategic decisions. Exploiting his Schadenfreude involves highlighting instances where his adversaries have overcome challenges and publicizing his setbacks. Invoking public disgrace and humiliation involves using satire and parody to ridicule his public statements and expose personal vulnerabilities.

Implementing these strategies involves media campaigns, diplomatic statements, leaks, public debates, and symbolic gestures. Strategically challenging Medvedev's authority, undermining his achievements, threatening his sense of security, and ridiculing his public image elicits an emotional response that might lead to losing control. However, these strategies should be cautiously employed, considering the risks and consequences of enraging a high-ranking political figure with perceived influence and power.

Medvedev's responses to provocation likely reflect heightened aggression, defensiveness, and attempts to reassert his authority and influence. Escalated nuclear threats, increased anti-Western rhetoric, personal attacks on Western leaders, appeals to nationalism and patriotism, threats of retaliation, provocative public statements, use of dehumanizing language, increased social media activity, claims of victimhood, and calls for strengthening alliances are possible outcomes. Such behavior risks growing tensions and instability in

international relations, necessitating careful monitoring and strategic responses from other global actors.

Dimon's hypothetical behavior on Flakka adds a humorous perspective to understanding his erratic actions, likely to provoke (an understated) response should this ever reach his desk. Imagining Medvedev waking up with boundless energy, crafting fiery diatribes, experiencing heightened paranoia, engaging in hyperactive strategic planning, and having aggressive outbursts provides a comical yet insightful twist. His delusions of grandeur, social media rampages, and dehumanizing language further illustrate his unpredictable behavior. The legend of Medvedev on Flakka grows, entertaining the global community while causing headaches for his handlers and diplomats.
